## Services at St Cyriac's 2019

14<sup>th</sup> April 10.30am      Procession of Palms  
Palm Sunday            Beginning at the School

We remember and re-enact Jesus' return to Jerusalem, riding on a donkey, welcomed by palm-waving crowds. And we recount the story of Jesus' last days with an interactive reading of the Gospel story.

14<sup>th</sup> April 6.30pm      Choral Evensong for Passiontide

A service of music and readings for Passiontide, set within the framework of a traditional Evensong

15<sup>th</sup> April 7.00pm      Stations of the Cross  
Holy Monday

A quiet and contemplative service where we follow the story of Jesus' last days in a thoughtful and meditative way.

16<sup>th</sup> April 7.00pm      Compline  
Holy Tuesday

A short service of prayer to close the day with the opportunity to continue our Lenten theme of self-examination, confession, and repentance.

17<sup>th</sup> April 9.30am      Holy Communion  
Holy Wednesday      with Prayers for Healing

A chance to receive Jesus in the most intimate of ways, through receiving Holy Communion, and a chance to place ourselves in God's hands for wholeness in body, mind and spirit.

18<sup>th</sup> April 7.00pm      The Last Supper  
Maundy Thursday

The events surrounding Jesus' last meal are re-enacted and commemorated. Jesus washed his disciples' feet, instituted a new kind of Passover meal which we call Communion, and then was abandoned by his friends who he asked to stay awake. These things are acted out and remembered in a way that engages our whole bodies – listening, singing, thinking, tasting, moving.

19<sup>th</sup> April 9.30am      Experience Easter  
Good Friday

A short informal and interactive service suitable for young families. Fun, stories, and Easter eggs (of course).

19<sup>th</sup> April 2.00pm      An Hour at the Cross

A quiet and meaningful service of reflection on the crucifixion, taking place during the last hour of Jesus' ordeal on the cross.

20<sup>th</sup> April 7.00pm      The Easter Vigil and  
Holy Saturday          Service of Light

Traditionally, each new day starts in the evening (taken from the book of Genesis) so Saturday evening is the beginning of Easter. We mark the end of our time of waiting, and the arrival of the light of the resurrection which has overcome the darkness of death.

21<sup>st</sup> April 10.30am      Easter Celebration  
Easter Day              with Holy Communion

A joyful celebration for the whole family. The joy of the resurrection, and a celebration of all that Jesus did for us. There may even be Easter Eggs too!
