## PILGRIM COURSE

Revd Victor will be leading a second course on the first Sunday of each month at 10am in St Bartholomew's, Corsham, from Sept 19-Mar 20 (omitting Jan and Feb) based on the Beatitudes, the challenging collection of sayings by Jesus known as the Sermon on the Mount. Understanding the Beatitudes and trying to live them out, is one of the best ways of following God and living the Christian vision for the world. It is about living and travelling as pilgrims together every day.

Each time there will be a handout for you to take home with some questions you might like to explore. To go alongside this we will provide two groups in the week following the Sunday—one on Tuesday mornings and another on Thursday evenings in **Church House** – to meet with others who may like to discuss and explore further.

## NEW ALL AGE SERVICE AT NESTON

Starting in September there will be an additional service on the 2nd Sunday at Neston. This informal service for all the family will take place every second Sunday of the month at 9.00am, and consists of a short service in church followed by a light breakfast in the church vestibule, and the opportunity to contribute to the beginning of the 10.00am service in church, which is either Morning Worship or Holy Communion depending on the availability of clergy. This will run for a 6-month trial period.

## Sunday 25 Aug 2019 – Bartholomew the Apostle/Trinity 10

### **Collect (St Bartholomew)**

Almighty and everlasting God, who gave to your apostle Bartholomew grace truly to believe and to preach your word: grant that your Church may love that word which he believed and may faithfully preach and receive the same; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **AMEN**

### **Old Testament Reading – Isaiah 43:8-13** (NRSVA)

Bring forth the people who are blind, yet have eyes, who are deaf, yet have ears! <sup>9</sup>Let all the nations gather together, and let the peoples assemble. Who among them declared this, and foretold to us the former things? Let them bring their witnesses to justify them, and let them hear and say, 'It is true.' <sup>10</sup>You are my witnesses, says the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen, so that you may know and believe me and understand that I am he. Before me no god was formed, nor shall there be any after me. <sup>11</sup>I, I am the Lord, and besides me there is no saviour. <sup>12</sup>I declared and saved and proclaimed, when there was no strange god among you; and you are my witnesses, says the Lord. <sup>13</sup>I am God, and also henceforth I am He; there is no one who can deliver from my hand; I work and who can hinder it?

### **New Testament Reading – 1 Corinthians 4:9-15** (NRSVA)

For I think that God has exhibited us apostles as last of all, as though sentenced to death, because we have become a spectacle to the world, to angels and to mortals. <sup>10</sup>We are fools for the sake of Christ, but you are wise in Christ. We are weak, but you are strong. You are held in honour, but we in disrepute. <sup>11</sup>To the present hour we are hungry and thirsty, we are poorly clothed and beaten and homeless, <sup>12</sup>and we grow weary from the work of our own hands. When reviled, we bless; when persecuted, we endure; <sup>13</sup>when slandered, we speak kindly. We have become like the rubbish of the world, the dregs of all things, to this very day.

<sup>14</sup>I am not writing this to make you ashamed, but to admonish you as my beloved children. <sup>15</sup>For though you might have ten thousand guardians in Christ, you do not have many fathers. Indeed, in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel.

### **Gospel Reading - Luke 12:24-30** (NRSVA)

<sup>24</sup>A dispute also arose among them as to which one of them was to be regarded as the greatest. <sup>25</sup>But he said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those in authority over them are called benefactors. <sup>26</sup>But not so with you; rather the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like one who serves. <sup>27</sup>For who is greater, the one who is at the table or the one who serves? Is it not the one at the table? But I am among you as one who serves.

<sup>28</sup>'You are those who have stood by me in my trials; <sup>29</sup>and I confer on you, just as my Father has conferred on me, a kingdom, <sup>30</sup>so that you may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and you will sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Lord of heaven and earth, as Jesus taught his disciples to be persistent in prayer, give us patience and courage never to lose hope, but always to bring our prayers before you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **AMEN**
